Dear Dr. Shammas and MCRF,

I am writing to thank you for the *Saving Legs: Saving Lives* books. The nearly 100 copies you donated were a tremendously welcome addition at two conferences held recently.

Like many health care professionals, I firmly believe in patient empowerment and education is a vital part of that concept. Since I am involved with chronic kidney disease and patients on dialysis, your books were especially important. As you are aware, Peripheral Vascular Disease has been identified as one of the five leading predictors of mortality in this population.

In late September, Renal Support Network sponsored a regional Patient Lifestyle Meeting in Mason City, Iowa. Patients and their families were treated to lunch and a day of educational sessions about kidney disease—and a copy of your book. Several speakers from the University of Iowa also requested additional copies for their respective clinics.

Later, in mid October, The NxStageUsers meeting was held in New Orleans, LA. Both patients and leading renal professionals from around the country attended the two day event to share their knowledge and experiences. The rest of the *Saving Legs, Saving Lives* books were distributed at that conference. 
